## Arise, Shine, for the Light is Come

Isaiah 60:1-3

This is an interesting passage for a number of reasons: 1) In the first and last step we see the "command" is given to arise, because 2) our light and glory is come from the Lord. 3) In contrast to the light is the pinnacle passage focusing on darkness. Why? Could it be to describe this earth in its corrupt sinful state—which is darkness? But regardless of the darkness, the Lord has and will bring light and glory to those who read these words who [as the context reveals] are those who have "turned from transgression in Jacob" (Isa 59:20) are the same ones who the Lord has made covenant with and put His Spirit upon. (Isaiah 59:21)
