

The Sanctuary – Court (Type /Antitype of the Gospel)

Courtyard

Defined: The area inside the white curtain where the sacrifices occurred and the priests performed the transfer of guilt and sin via the blood of the sacrifice into the holy place.

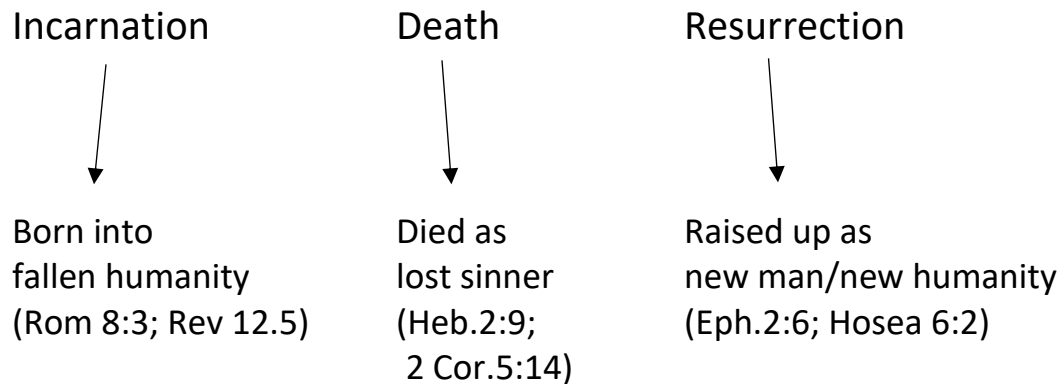
TERMS:

- White Curtain /Hangings
- Veil

- Colors (Scarlet, Blue, Purple, Fine Linen, Gold Threads)

TYPE (figure)	ANTITYPE (Reality)
Sinner brings lamb to be sacrificed on his/her account. Sin is transferred by the laying on of hands (whole weight) and confessing over head of the animal. Forgiveness/pardon granted as animal is slain, being the penalty of the broken law of God. Sinner is free of guilt & sin, but not entirely, for record of guilt transferred thru blood to holy place until Day of Atonement.	

As in the typical service the high priest laid aside his pontifical robes and officiated in the white linen dress of an ordinary priest; so Christ laid aside His royal robes and garbed Himself with humanity and offered sacrifice, Himself the priest, Himself the victim. –AA 33.3

OBJECTIVE FACTS OF THE GOSPEL

- God put whole human “In Christ” at incarnation.
- God wrought out the obedience of every man, woman and child, “In Christ” throughout His life at every level of development
- Adam’s condemnation was reversed “In Christ” at the Cross; every human received a verdict of acquittal at the cross (**Justification**).

SUBJECTIVE EXPERIENCE OF THE GOSPEL

- “Christ in You” is the ongoing experience of (**sanctification**).
- Only Believers can experience “Christ in you” through the new birth.
- “Christ in you” involves the cooperation of believers who by faith are walking in the Spirit.

Are being Saved.... From the Power and Nature of Sin (Our Sanctification) -Rom6:13,14

Will be Saved.... From the Nature and Presence of Sin (Our Glorification) -1 Cor 15.51,53
