Golden Image—Worship or Death Decree!

In Daniel 3 we also can see Christ revealed through the drama of the image set up for worship on the plane of Dura. It is also typology for the final crisis which God's people will be subject to in the future. Let us see how this is so:

Christ in Daniel

Literal King Nebuchadnezzar set up an image And invited all the world to its dedication on the plain of Dura. vs.1-2 All people, nations and languages that at the sound of the (music) all are to fall down and worship the golden vss.4-12 image. -- A Second Death Decree— The three worthies were commanded worship; but the king would yet give them another opportunity (a way out) vss.13-18 by choice, when he called them to him. The three worthies in essence said this, O King! We have the right against selfincrimination. The onus is on you to vs.16-18 show us our follow. We would rather be true to God; (Acts 5:29) and so we speak only as a witness to you. Submit to this God, O King! God heard the prayer of Daniel and his 3 friends in the night season and Daniel "blessed the God of heaven"...for the vs 26 answer to their prayers, for "wisdom and might are His." Daniel thanked and praised God for making the matter

Spiritual

Jesus was tempted to fall down and worship the prince of this world in the wilderness just as the three worthies were tempted in Babylon.

Christ was given a choice that if He'd just bow down and worship the prince of this world, He wouldn't have to die (go to the cross)

But Christ as God, and also as man, rebuked the devil, get thee hence, saying "Thou shalt worship the Lord thy God and Him only shalt thou serve."

Christ not only appeared with these men (vs.24,25) in the fires, but this was typology for what Jesus would encounter when "His furnace was heated 7x hotter (Gethsemane) and the mightiest empire—Rome would sanction His death. (He would die the second death, but the grave could not hold Him). And like the furnace fire of Babylon where the King of Babylon saw the Son of God, He came and called the worthies out of the fire, just as God the Father called Christ on the third day out of the tomb.



Christ in Daniel -Chp 3 Con't

Literal

Just as the princes and governors and captains And counsellors saw the three worthies of which—

- > the fire has no power
- > nor head hairs singed
- > neither their coats changed
- > nor the smell of fire passed on them

The King of Babylon announced "blessed the God of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, who hath set his angel and delivered his servants that trusted in him, and have changed the king's word and yielded their bodies, that they might not serve nor worship any god, except their own God."

Spiritual

So, King Jesus came forth from the tomb glorified and all the world has come to know and will come to learn of the living Christ, which conquered the grave. (Isa. 61; Rev 18.1)

At "the voice of God", (about the 7th plague) the Father will reveal the "two tables of stone" for the world to see it is the rule of judgment which will sweep aware the darkness of superstition and heresy from every mind."

He delivers "the everlasting covenant" to His people pronouncing a blessing "on those who have honored God by keeping His Sabbath holy."

This happens right before the second coming.
