Typical of Hebrew poetic style, it really comes through in song, by the Hebrew people. Here after the children of Israel came out of Egypt, the Lord of heaven delivered them through the red sea, miraculously. As a result, all Israel lifted up the voice in song and praise to the Most High. Moses takes up the tune, then Miriam and the women sings answer in song.

Though this is a simple chiasm, note the B statements: God's right hand is glorious in power, with the corresponding question, "Who is like Thee, glorious in holiness. He is glorious in power and holiness. It was a shame that only days later, Israel lost this attitude of thanksgiving in praise, when they started complaining due to lack of food and water. But Oh, if they had kept the deliverances of God clearly in mind, what a people they would have become, reflecting "God's glorious power and holiness."
