



The “Let” Principle *A Profound Reality*

In the Beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. (Gen 1:1) How did He create? He spoke and it was (Ps.33:9). Gen 1:3 – Let there be light

At the very beginning of the Bible, this powerful truth involving communication is left on record for all time. If God said, let there be light and light existed, then is it not possible for mortal man after the Fall, to experience this power of God in his own life, especially since many passages in Scripture take what we see here in the natural and apply it spiritually? [We have an example that it is possible –the life of Enoch.] Here are some Scriptural examples of the Let principle--

- Philippians 2:5 – *Let* this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus.
[a mind not attracted to sin, but holiness]
Application: Just let it be. Say, “Lord, let it be.” And the creative Word that spoke, “Let there be light” will create in You His mind as you permit Him, as You let Him.
- Colossians 3:15 – *Let* the peace of God rule in your heart
Application: Just let it be. The peace of God comes when we joyfully experience our sins forgiven. His peace comes when His love dwells in us and drives away all fear and doubt.
- Matt 16:24 (Luke 9:23) – If any will come after Me, *let* him deny himself, take up his cross and follow Me.
Application: Let Christ’s ability to deny Himself come into your mind.
- Colossians 3:16 – *Let* the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom.
(one of the 7 spirits)
Application: As you just let it happen, the Holy Spirit will create a longing desire in you to hunger and thirst after the word of righteousness.

These are just a few examples of how the “Let” principle works on a practical level. You are relinquishing it to Him, to allow His creative power to work in you. Because it dates back to creation week, it is God’s original form and ideal way of communicating to His intelligent creation. God’s word is still as powerful as it was in the beginning.
