

## Revelation 15 Great and Marvellous Sign

- A Seven angels having
- B seven last plagues;
- C in them filled up the wrath of God
- D they got the victory, stand on sea of glass,

*They sing song of Moses the servant of God,  
and the song of the Lamb, saying,*

**E Great and marvellous thy works, Lord God Almighty;  
just and true thy ways, King of saints.**

**E Who shall not fear thee, O Lord, and glorify thy name?  
...all nations shall...worship; for thy judgments manifest.**

*And after that I looked, behold, the temple of the  
tabernacle of the testimony in heaven opened:*

- D they came out of temple, clothed in white linen
- C seven angels full of the wrath of God,

*The temple was filled with smoke from the glory of God,  
and from his power; and no man able to enter the temple,*

- B till the seven plagues of
- A the seven angels fulfilled.

Interpretation—God’s people will bring the seven last plagues, for they are filled up with the wrath of God. What! Filled up with the wrath of God? Where did they get this from? They received it from the throne of God. They gave the three angel’s message and it accomplished its work; the final test has been brought upon the world. The people of God have received “the latter rain” and have proved themselves loyal to the divine precepts, receiving “the seal of the living God” (GC 613.2). By accomplishing the work God gave them and proving loyal and true to that message and to God, they are sealed and prepared for the trying hour before them. Because that is the case, when Jesus leaves the sanctuary, they are preserved from the plagues ready to fall. Thus, since God’s people are ready and sealed, in essence they bring the plagues, to a world that has proved unfaithful in rejecting the messages that would “save” them. Thus, they must reap the consequences. In this sense, the people of God bring the seven last plagues for they will live through the time of trouble without an intercessor in the temple in heaven. Much more can be said about this chapter.
